

Financial Update



Thank you for your continued financial support of St. Paul's Lutheran Church!

Giving to start the year in 2023 is up slightly compared to last year (+5.4%) but expenses are also up mainly due to the carryover of some 2022 expenses paid in January. The increase in expenses is from a payment to our benefits provider for 2022, the final payment on the boiler and increased costs for snow removal

and utilities this year. We've been able to manage our cash flow because of the surplus carried over from the Covid period when our expenses were drastically reduced.
